Agenda Topic: Approval of Meeting Notes from 9/17 (Katrina Forest)

Agenda Topic: Announcements, in particular multiple authentication login plans

- The slides are in box.
- It was brought up that we need to make sure that external people who have a net id, and collaborators know about this change. There is a plan for that after the rollout of the internal net id changes.
- Katrina will draft an email and send to Andy & Jan Cheetham. Jan will take it to the IAM council
 meeting. (post meeting note Andy and Jan have been active already and have discussed with IAM)

Agenda Topic: Electronic Lab Notebook update (Nick Tincher and Jan Cheetham)

- The <u>slides</u> from the presentation are in box.
- The current contract will be extended for an additional year, so there are 2 years to address questions and get RFPs.
- Currently we are paying \$75,000/year for a 5 year contract. This was based on 10,000 potential
 research users. There are only about 15% of eligible people using it (although this is actually a little
 higher than equivalent statistic at peer universities). It will cost \$86,000 for the transition year. It was
 paid for by the provost's office under Paul DeLuca for 3 years and the last 2 years by Campus Software
 Library.
- RTAG said they would like to get updates on the progress and provide their opinion.

Agenda Topic: Discussion of initiatives for computing and data science at UW, including new school recommendations and Data Science Initiative and the RTAG working group recommendations for a leadership position in the VCRGE which we discussed last month.

- Norman said the 3 parallel tracks we have going on right now are 1) OVCRGE is working with the CIO to
 develop a plan to provide baseline computing infrastructure, including data storage, to all faculty on
 campus. RTAG is a critical adviser in that effort 2) the Chancellor wanted computer science on campus
 looked at in relation to other campuses; and 3) investigating the possibility for a Data Science Institute.
- Brian said there is a movement to add an undergraduate degree in Data Science.
